The Colina music department program is designed to provide students with opportunities to be expressive, engage in critical thinking, and learn about themselves in ways unknown to them. The elements that we will use to do this are through singing, listening, and creating. Of course, the friendships and good times that develop are as important as anything else!

Objectives

The students will be able to:

- 1. To sing in a safe and comfortable environment
- 2. To critically listen, think, and respond in the classroom
- 3. To understand the function of musical notation/increase in sight reading music
- 4. To understand the basics of vocal production/vocal health
- 5. To perform with accuracy, energy, and musicianship
- 6. To sing with accurate diction to communicate clearly
- 7. To sing with accurate pitch, in unison and harmony
- 8. To learn the positive effects of music and how music applies to everyday life
- 9. To develop individual leadership and teamwork characteristics

<u>Goals</u>

- 1. To be regular and prompt in attendance
- 2. To arrive to class prepared each day
- 3. To have respect for yourself, others, and the environment we work in
- 4. To take responsibility and ownership of your daily actions in the classroom
- 5. To contribute positively to your music education and to the group by the best use of your talents and gifts at all times

<u>Grades</u>: All grading information can be found in Q. Please be sure to activate your account and use this software to stay in tune with grading. Mistakes that are made in the grading process are much easier to fix when the error is found early. Grading will be according to the following categories.

Performances	50%
Daily Classwork	30%

Assignments	15%
Assessments (Quizzes and Tests)	5%

Daily Classwork: Each student will be given a possible of 10 points for every scheduled class day. These will be put in as weekly grades. Our classwork is our rehearsal time. Each student will be graded on engagement and mastering concepts and skills taught each class rehearsal.

Performances:

- All public performances will be worth 100 points. Points will be deducted for not having appropriate concert attire or tardiness to the call time.
- These performances are culminating events for weeks and months of classroom work.
- If an emergency does occur and a performance or rehearsal was missed, please speak to Mrs. Rolniak on an individual basis outside of class so make-up work can be assigned.

Excused absences are defined as:

- 1. Personal Illness—if you are absent from school on the day of the concert or dress rehearsal and feel well enough to attend, you are expected to do so. If you aren't feeling well enough, your parent must email me.
- 2. Family Emergency—illness in the family or other type of family emergency. The following things are NOT considered emergencies: babysitting, lack of transportation or not having concert clothes.
- 3. Unavoidable family trip—please make every attempt to coordinate family vacations with your concert schedule.
- If a student has an unexcused absence for a performance, he/she will NOT be able to make up the missed grade.

Classroom Rules:

Choir students are expected to follow these rules:

- Be in your assigned place with choir folder and pencil ready to rehearse when the bell rings
- No gum, food or drinks allowed during rehearsal. Students may bring a bottle for water.
- Be respectful to everyone. Use appropriate language and demonstrate good manners at all times.
- Be engaged at all times—even when another section is working on a part
- Participate to your fullest!

Donations:

CVUSD does not provide any funding for the Colina choir program. All performances we attend (both on & off campus), and the costs associated with those activities (transportation, piano accompanist, festival fees, etc.) must be paid from the Colina choir account. The amount of money in the account fluctuates annually depending upon fundraisers and fair share donations. Since we are a self-funded program, we ask for **\$100.00** donation from each participating child. This helps to cover the costs stated above as well as classroom materials (sheet music, etc.).

That's only \$0.56 a day! This is a bargain for quality vocal instruction and priceless memories!! 💿

Fair Share donations can be made by cash or check. Make checks payable to *Colina Middle School* and reference "choir" & your child's name on the memo line. Please make the donation as soon as possible. You may choose to break the fair share donation into installments if needed. No student will be turned away from choir if a family is unable to participate in Fair Share. Keep in mind that Fair Share sustains the program. Please make every effort to meet all fair share deadlines. It is through Fair Share that people get paid, materials are provided to your child, and wonderful experiences can be planned.
